1373. Mrs S V Kalyan (DA) to ask the Minister of Water and Environmental Affairs:

- (1) Whether, with reference to her reply to question 252 on 2 March 2010, there has been any further improvement in the state of waste water treatment at the Thaba Chweu municipality following the directive issued on 28 September 2009; if not, why not; if so, what are the relevant details;
- whether she has been informed of any other incidents where sewage has leaked from sewerage infrastructure since the directive was issued; if so, what are the relevant details?

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REPLY:

(1) Yes, the water quality data taken by my Department has shown improvements in the quality of the final effluent discharged into the Dorps River. As indicated within Table 1 below, there are considerable improvements in the pH, Electrical Conductivity (EC) and Chemical Oxygen Demand (COD).Orthophosphates (PO₄) have improved but are still not complying with the license conditions. Levels of Nitrates (NO₃) and E-coli are still an area of concern as no improvements have taken place.

My Department has not taken any further actions against the municipality as it was placed under provincial administration in terms of Section 139 (1) (b) of the Constitution and an Administrator was appointed. My Department is currently engaging the Administrator to ensure that the matter is attended to, and an indication has already been given by the Administrator that all the compliance gaps would be addressed.

(2) Yes, there was an incident in December 2009 where a Pump Station overflew, resulting in raw sewage flowing into the Marambane River which drains into Dorps River. On 13 April 2010, my Department issued a notice of intention to issue a directive in terms of Section 19 (3) of the National Water Act, 1998 (Act No. 36 1998). The municipality has not made any representations regarding measures to be put in place to control the incident, but my Department intends to address this matter as part of the ongoing engagements with the municipality through the appointed Administrator.
