# **★169.** Ms M S Khawula (EFF) to ask the Minister of Water and Sanitation:

What steps has her department taken to fix the leaks in our water system that cause our country to lose 1,3 trillion litres of water in one year?

#### REPLY:

The Department takes direct responsibility for 1080km of bulk pipe-line which is conveying raw water as part of our National Water Resource Management accountabilities. As part of routine operations, the water control duties include "driving" the pipelines to detect any abnormalities (which include leak detection), that will inform required maintenance work. A case in point is, the department implemented an integrity assessment project using advanced technology for the pre-stressed concrete pipelines on the Usutu system whilst in operation to identify pipe-sections where leaks may occur and thus require replacement.

Although the department does not have a direct mandate to deal with the physical fixing of water leaks at municipality level, it supports this government sphere by building capacity of the requisite water loss management skills through the War on Leaks programme. This programme aims to assist municipalities with fixing water leaks through providing essential skills of artisans, water agents and plumbers to unemployed South African youth.
