Are we on Track?

In the provision of sanitation services to all leaving no one behind

The aspirations of the National Development Plan, 2030 vision of:

- Achieving <u>universal</u>, <u>sustainable</u>, and <u>reliable</u> sanitation provision for all.
- All South Africans having full, <u>affordable</u> and reliable Access to Adequate and Equitable sanitation

The Key Actions of the National Water and Sanitation Master Plan

- Development and implementation of a <u>long-term plan for the turn-around</u> of sanitation services in the country
- Alignment of monitoring institutions to support National and International reporting programme, e.g. SDGs, Agenda 63 and AMCOW
- Develop <u>new policies and strategies</u> on matters not previously addressed, in consultation with all stakeholders, to facilitate the sustainability of various water sector programmes
- **Alternative sanitation**: Develop and demonstrate and validate appropriate alternative, water-less and off grid sanitation solutions





Are We on Track? Realising The Right to Dignity in School Sanitation

The Constitution, 1996 (Act no 108 of 1996)

- Every child has a <u>right</u> to have their dignity respected and not be treated in a degrading way.
- Every child has a <u>right</u> to an environment that is not harmful to their health or wellbeing.
- Every child has a <u>right to privacy</u>.
- Every child has a <u>right</u> to protection from neglect, abuse or degradation.
- Every child has a <u>right</u> to not be required to do anything that puts their health at risk
