## Deputy Minister Tshwete hands over media classroom to Injongo Primary School in Khayelitsha

It was jubilation and ululations at the Injongo Primary School in Khayelitsha, Western Cape as the Deputy Minister of Water and Sanitation (DWS) Ms Pamela Tshwete handed over a media classroom on 18 August 2017.

This came after Injongo Primary school put the Western Cape Province on the map when they scooped the first prize of the Baswa Le Meetse (BLM) National competition in 2016.

The BLM competition is a programme under the 2020 Vision aimed at grade 6 leaners. In this competition learners can choose to compete from 5 categories namely drama, poster, music praise poetry and poetry. The Injongo Primary School leaners were announced as the overall winners in the music category.

Addressing the crowds during the handing over ceremony, Deputy Minister Tshwete said the school must look after the facility and equipment to ensure it benefits future generations. The state-of-the art classroom was equipped with 21 computers, an electronic white board and an overhead projector.
