The United Nations General Assembly declared 2013 as the year of International Water Cooperation.

The Department of Water Affairs thorough its 2020 Vision for Water Educational Programme presents the Baswa Le Meetse (BLM) competition which links water and sanitation with arts and culture by encouraging learners to showcase our cultural heritage while preserving our natural resources.

The Grade 6 learners convey health and hygiene messages through drama, music, poetry, praise singing and poster development. Their projects are guided by the theme **"Washing of Hands, use and care for Sanitation** *Facilities for a Healthy Life".*

By using arts and culture we are preserving one of the traditions that make us a great rainbow nation. The Baswa Le Meetse competition takes us to the roots of our heritage in the performing arts.

Eco School will enable us to achieve water and environmental sustainability in schools and their surrounding communities as well as supporting Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) in the national Curriculum

To the learners, I encourage you to continue or to start participating in the Eco schools project.
