The department is investing in our youth by providing knowledge and skills development. This translates to promoting water efficiency, taking care of toilet facilities, good health and hygiene. I therefore want to persuade you to consider studies that are related to the Water sector.

The goal of the Foundational Youth Empowerment, grade 4-6 participants, is to change behaviour and raise awareness on Water and Sanitation issues. Through the categories of Drama, Music, Poetry, Praise Poetry, and Postering you will be able to show and tell us about this year's theme. We also welcome back last year's winning schools who will be participating in the Intervention project, as we are trying to bridge the gap between theory and practice.

For the Secondary Youth Empowerment, grade 9-11 participants, our goal is to encourage you to study towards Water and Sanitation related fields. The Department of Water and Sanitation offers 67 bursaries every year which are:

- 20 for the SA Youth Water Prize;
- 20 for Aqua Enduro; as well as
- 27 for Public Speaking.

This opportunity continues after tertiary level whereby the Department of Water and Sanitation's goal is to expose the graduates to real time professionals and to offer work based experiences for Professional Registrations.

With your support and contribution in these youth programmes we are set to change the water and sanitation outlook of South Africa. As young leaders of tomorrow we must invest in you in such a way that they will sustain this environment for many generations to come.

It is only fitting that I leave you with these words from uTata Nelson Mandela. "To the youth of today, I also have a wish to make: be the scriptwriters of your destiny and feature yourself as stars that showed the way towards a brighter future".
