


The project aims to:

- Available information/data reviewed and assessed per water resource
- Overall Preliminary Findings and Gaps:
 - ✓ Comprehensive River and Wetland rehabilitation guidelines exist readily available
 - ✓ There are no comprehensive guidelines for Estuaries, Lakes, Dams & Groundwater resources

* The task to comprehensively document and report on the above highlighted findings/gaps will be undertaken as part of the upcoming **Situation Assessment**
