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E1.1 Notice and Invitation to submit an Expression of Interest

The Department of Water and Sanitation invites expressions of interest from contractors to enter into framework agreements over a four-year term without a commitment to a quantum of work to provide management contractor services relating to Bulk Water and Wastewater Infrastructure and other Regional Infrastructure Projects. The services of the management contractor are intended to support the work of the Departments Construction East Unit in delivering various water and sanitation projects and the provision of goods and services.

The contract will be based on the NEC 3 Engineering and Construction Contract (Option F: Management contract).

Respondents must have a CIDB contractor grading designation of 8 CE or higher.

Only respondents who have suitable experience in the delivery of bulk water resources such as bulk-pipelines, dams, water abstraction works or water transfer schemes including associated specialist mechanical and electrical works are eligible to have their submissions evaluated

E3: Indicative scope of work

1 Background

1.1 DWS Construction Units

The Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS) has its own Construction Units which undertake a range of water infrastructure projects falling within the DWS's mandate. These construction infrastructure projects are clustered in 5 construction unit offices based over different regions. Construction East unit office based in Standerton in the Mpumalanga Province.

Resources are required for the delivery of infrastructure projects i.e., finance, fuel, people, materials, and plant which are incorporated into the works and equipment which is used to provide the works but are not incorporated into the work. Equipment can either be owned or hired. DWS owns and maintains most of its equipment but needs to hire some specialised or bespoke equipment where it makes no sense to own and maintain such equipment. DWS also has a manufacturing capability in its workshop to manufacture certain components for incorporation into the works e.g., large diameter pipes and associated assemblies. It has people to perform the works, but as is the case with private sector contractors, it needs to procure materials and subcontract portions of the works to specialist companies who have the necessary capabilities to perform aspects of the works.

DWS management has recognised the need for a step change in approach to enable DWS construction units to deliver projects efficiently and economically. It is anticipated that the Management tender will assist in the expediating of the implementation of the Projects.

1.2 DWS Infrastructure Procurement Strategy

DWS has developed an Infrastructure Procurement Strategy which establishes the selected packaging, contracting, pricing, and targeting strategy and procurement procedure for categories of procurement spend. The objectives of this strategy are:

primary procurement objectives (tangible and intangible objectives):

- 1) accelerate progress in improving the reliability of the water service and access to sustainable sanitation services;
- 2) respond rapidly to emerging needs and emergencies as and when they arise in the shortest possible time;
- enable DWS Construction Units to function efficiently, effectively and economically through the timeous and in sequence delivery of resources to sites or workshops;

- 4) reduce costs through more efficient procurement practices;
- 5) reduce the time taken to solicit tenders and award contracts;
- 6) improve the quality of existing and future infrastructure;
- 7) increase the internal capacity and capability of DWS to efficiently, economically and effectively deliver infrastructure projects; and
- 8) deliver value for money, while minimising the scope for corruption.

secondary objectives (that which can be promoted through a procurement):

- 1) promote broad based black economic empowerment in support of the economic transformation of South Africa;
- 2) develop internal skills and capacity to execute projects;
- 3) support skills development by increasing the number of people who have part qualifications, national qualifications and professional designations awarded by statutory councils;
- 4) promote and support local participation throughout the supply chain and local employment through the delivery of infrastructure;
- 5) promote enterprise development amongst CIDB registered contractors who are black owned or at least 30% black women owned;
- 6) promote local production and content of designated goods.

The DWS has recently also put in place a Supply Chain Management Policy for Infrastructure Procurement and associated standard operating procedures to implement the strategy.

2 Objective of the call for an expression of interest

The objective of this call for an expression of interest is to prequalify interested CIDB registered contractors so that they can be invited to submit tenders for management contracting services within the Free State, Mpumalanga, Kwazulu Natal, Gauteng and Eastern Cape Provinces:

- a) for the Bulk Water and Wastewater Infrastructure and other Regional Infrastructure Projects as well as other bulk pipeline, dam, water abstraction works or water transfer schemes including associated specialist mechanical and electrical works projects falling within the area where the Construction East Unit has responsibilities; and

3 Framework agreements

- Re-Lining of the existing Canal with a 100mm thick reinforced concrete lining.
- Construction of Reject and Screen Structures.
- Repair of Bridges and repair of super passes.
- Installation of specialized Handrails.
- Installation of drainage system.
- Repair/demolishing of damaged slabs.
- Construction of new Canal Gravel Road.
- Landscaping.

b) Bucket Eradication Project - Senekal

These sewer lines consist of Class 34 and Class 12 uPVC pipes ranging from 160mm to 400mm in diameter according to design specifications. The secondary part is the construction of sewer pump stations and collection sumps. The pump stations are placed at low laying points throughout the township and will collect and pump the sewerage to the main wastewater treatment works.

Extent of the works

- Site establishment
- Site clearance along the pipeline routes
- Excavation of pipeline trenches
- Bedding material for the pipelines
- Providing and laying of required pipelines
- Providing and placing of suitable blanket material for the pipelines
- Testing of pipes
- Constructing manholes
- Fix and repair existing roads, fences and services where required.
- Reinforced concrete works according to the drawings for the construction of the pump
- Brickwork according to the drawings for the construction of the pump stations
- Fencing around pump station areas

c) Temporary Syphon Mthatha Dam

Construction East was appointed to construct a temporary syphon over the embankment of the Mthatha dam.

The outlet works of the Mthatha Dam feeds water through two pipes located underneath the dam spillway return channel via a pump station to Thornhill Water Treatment Works in Mthatha. These pipes provide the main supply of raw water to Mthatha.

It is assumed that one of the pipes has burst underneath the spillway return channel, resulting in excessive leakage and a high drop in pressure. The pressure drop has resulted in a significant reduction of supply to the treatment works, which is insufficient to meet the current requirements, while the leakage water is resulting in excessive erosion in the area surrounding the leak, accelerating the deterioration of the infrastructure.

A siphon was therefore proposed over the dam wall. Due to the rapid deterioration and accelerated erosion, as well as the reduced supply resulting from the excessive leakage, the project is regarded as very urgent. The system is very vulnerable, and complete failure with dire consequences is highly likely should no intervention be exercised imminently.

The work entails the construction and installation of a siphon (4 x 450 mm diameter pipelines) over the Mthatha dam, as well as a pipeline (1 400 mm diameter) from the manifold chamber to the connection point of the completed constructed pipeline by OR Municipality connecting to the Thornhill Water Treatment Works. The pipe works shall have sufficient capacity to supply the Thornhill Treatment Works with 85 ML/day over a 24-hour day under gravity flow conditions. At this flow rate a maximum drawdown of 3.16 m from the dam's FSL should be achievable. The work consists of a manifold chamber in which the four 450mm siphon pipes will enter one pipe. Four isolation valves will be fitted inside this chamber, one on each siphon pipe. Furthermore, two gate valves will be installed on a scour pipe within the chamber. A 1.4 m nominal diameter transfer pipe, which will be trenched and buried, from the manifold chamber up to the connection point has a length is approximately 180 meters. The works consist of the following:

- Four 450mm Steel Pipelines consisting of flanged pipe lengths bolted together. The length of the siphon
 is approximately 120 meters. The upstream end will be fitted with foot valves and the downstream end
 will be fitted with isolation valves before entering a common manifold.
- A concrete encasing for the pipes over the crest of the dam. The pipes cut through the dam crest and the materials removed from the embankment will be replaced with concrete. This will be a two-phase construction in order to maintain the existing crest elevation at all times.
- A priming chamber on the crest of the dam, at the highest point on the siphon. Each of the four siphon
 pipes will be fitted with an air release pipe, as well as a priming pipe, all fitted within the priming
 chamber.
- A concrete platform upstream of the priming chamber.
- Installation of steel cradle structure to house and support the four siphon pipes upstream of the dam crest. The one end of steel cradle will hinge at a point on the concrete platform above the Full Supply Level, and the other end will rest on an embankment approximately 9 meters below the water surface. The structure will be approximately 4 meters wide, 30 meters long and 1.3 meters high. It will be fitted with buoyancy tanks for ease of installation and for raising the structure as and when required for future work and maintenance. The structure will be supplied by the Employer. A concrete cradle starting downstream of the concrete encasing on the dam crest and ending at the toe dam wall. The cradle will house the four siphon pipes.
- A manifold chamber in which the four 450mm siphon pipes will enter one pipe. Four isolation valves
 will be fitted inside this chamber, one on each siphon pipe. Furthermore, two gate valves will be
 installed on a scour pipe within the chamber.
- A 1.4m nominal diameter transfer pipe, trench and buried, from the manifold chamber up to the connection pointed at the existing pump station. The length is approximately 450 meters.

d) Mzimvubu Water Project

Based on the planning undertaken by the Department of Water and Sanitation the scope of the Mzimvubu Water Project that was granted Environmental Authorisation (EA) consists of the following infrastructure components.

Ntabelanga Dam and Associated Works

In order to cater for the multi-purpose objectives of the project, including inter-basin transfer, Ntabelanga dam is designed to have a storage capacity of 490 million m3 for domestic water supply, hydropower generation and irrigated agriculture. Associated works including the operators' compound, water treatments work, wastewater treatment works, and access roads form part of the works. Single access to site and realignment of inundated local roads are the only roads to be constructed as part of the project excluding any roads built by the Department of Water and Sanitation as part of advance infrastructure prior to appointment of the service provider. In addition, local roads damaged by construction vehicles will be upgraded in accordance with the conditions of EIA.

Lalini Dam and Hydropower Scheme

In addition to the Ntabelanga dam constructed for potable water and irrigation water supply, the Lalini dam is designed to have a storage capacity of 232 million m3 to generate hydropower for cross-subsidising the operational energy requirements of the conjunctive scheme. Water is released from Ntabelanga dam to support hydropower generation at Lalini dam situated downstream on the same river (the Tsitsa River). The Lalini storage capacity is designed to also capture the incremental runoff generated from the intermediate catchment between the two dams. In this way, the Lalini dam acts primarily as a balancing dam to regulate variable streamflow before it is directed to the power plant to meet the operational requirements of the turbines. In addition to supplying the operational energy requirements of the scheme, the hydropower generated at the Lalini dam provides surplus revenue that greatly improves the project economics. The Ntabelanga and Lalini dams will be operated as a conjunctive scheme to make the scheme sustainable over its useful life; the Lalini dam must therefore be viewed as an integral part of the solution.

Potable Bulk Distribution Infrastructure

The bulk distribution infrastructure for potable water includes primary distribution infrastructure, secondary distribution infrastructure and local reticulation. The primary and secondary distribution infrastructure is implemented by the Department of Water and Sanitation and transferred afterwards to Amatola Water to own, operate and maintain using collected revenue. The construction of local reticulation is the responsibility of the district municipalities of OR Tambo, Alfred Nzo and Joe Gqabi,each responsible for the schemes in their area of jurisdiction. The secondary distribution infrastructure and local reticulation which will be connected to the primary distribution infrastructure through off-take points need to be optimised before implementation.

Irrigation Conveyance Infrastructure

The proposed irrigation development is located in areas around the Town of Tsolo and along the Tsitsa River downstream of Ntabelanga dam. The conveyance infrastructure delivers raw water released from Ntabelanga dam to field edge of the irrigation areas while the on-farm developments deliver water to the crops and provide for other services on the farms such as roads and storage sheds. The conveyance infrastructure is implemented and operated by the Department of Water and Sanitation while on-farm developments are implemented by the Department of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development (DALRRD) and the emerging farmers are each responsible for their operations.

e) Other Works

The Construction East Unit may also be called upon to undertake projects relating to any water and sanitation infrastructure related projects including those relating to water resources, bulk supply, water use reticulations, sanitation and outfall sewers and wastewater treatment and return flow which may be planned or arise from an emergency.

4.2 Required Services

The works may comprise any or all the following over a four-year term without any commitment to a quantum of work:

- a) the provision of engineering and construction works including any level of design responsibility for a site;
- b) the supply and delivery of goods, materials, construction plant and equipment to a delivery place or site;
- c) the supply of plant and related services including design, manufacture, delivery and installation for a site:
- d) the servicing, maintenance, and repair of DWS construction plant and equipment;
- e) the provision of professional services which are required to support the work of an Employer's Construction Unit or for a site; and
- f) the management and provision of a service to support the work of an Employer's Construction Unit or for an affected property for a period of time.

5 Procurement strategy

The Employer intends entering into a framework agreement with a limited number of contractors, following a competitive selection process (qualified procedure). The NEC3 Engineering and Construction Contract (ECC), Option F: Management contract will form the basis of the framework agreement entered into with the Employer. The management contractor's responsibilities for construction work are the same as those of a contractor working under one of the other options provided in the NEC3 ECC for engineering and constructions works. However, the management contractor performs only a limited amount of construction works typically relating to site establishment and de-establishment and may be called upon to provide the DWS Construction Unit with resources. The remainder of work will be contracted from local sub-contractors and suppliers who will be subcontracted through direct contracts with the contractor, who acts as a management contractor.

The management contractor tenders his Fee and is paid on a cost reimbursable basis i.e. Defined Cost uplifted by his Fee percentage. Defined Cost includes subcontract amounts and the prices of the work done by the Contractor himself less Disallowed Cost. Disallowed Cost incudes costs not justified by accounts and record, costs not in accordance with a Subcontractor's contract, costs incurred because procedures were not followed and payment to a Subcontractor for work which the Contractor is to do himself and the Contractor's management.

The management contractor is responsible for supplying management services. The management contractor's Fee will increase if subcontractors' prices (part of Defined Cost to the contractor) increase due to compensation events. However, he will not receive separate payment for his work in dealing with compensation events and he will not receive any additional Fee for work on compensation events which does not lead to an increase in subcontractors' prices.

The NEC3 ECC will be modified to accommodate the range of works required in addition to engineering and construction works i.e. the supply and delivery of goods, materials, equipment and plant to a delivery place, the provision of professional services and the management and provision of a service to support the work of an Employer's Construction Unit or for an affected property for a period of time. Such works will also be undertaken on the basis of Defined Cost uplifted by a Fee.

The Respondents will be evaluated in a two-phase process.

- Phase 1 will be this document; the Expression of Interest for the framework agreement. This will be evaluated and all respondents who comply to the requirements as set out will be requested to complete a second document.
- Phase 2: Respondents who are invited to submit tenders will be evaluated on the basis of financial
 offer, preference, quality and other requirements. Tenderers will be required to tender their direct fee
 percentage and subcontracted fee percentages. These parameters will be reduced to a comparative
 offer in terms of a tender assessment schedule. A framework agreement will be entered into with the

highest scoring tenderers.

6 Secondary procurement objectives and obligations

Respondents will be required in the performance of the contract to attain key performance indicators relating to the aforementioned secondary objectives in the execution of orders.
