**2. ESSENTIAL COMPLIANCE REQUIREMENTS AMENDED UNDER THE TENDERER'S OBLIGATIONS (Tender's obligations: Item 5.1.1, on page 5)**

**Only those tenderers who satisfy the eligibility evaluation criteria and who provided the required evidence in their tender submissions and is also complying with the following requirements are eligible to have their tenders evaluated:**

- a) the Respondent is registered on the Central Supplier Database (CSD) for the South African government (see <https://secure.csd.gov.za/>).
- b) the Respondent has completed the Compulsory Declaration and there are no legal reasons for not permitting the respondent from contracting with the Employer;
- c) the Respondent, is tax compliant or provides written proof from SARS that the respondent has made arrangements to meet outstanding tax obligations;
- d) the Respondent can provide financial statements complying with applicable legislation for the preceding financial year within 12 months of the year end.

**NB: The Tenderer needs to satisfy the requirement of clause 6.8 and 6.11.**

**An Entity is not eligible to submit a bid if:**

- a) the Tenderer does not comply with the legal requirements of the Department's Procurement.
- b) the Entity submitting the bid is under restrictions or has principals who are under restriction to participate in the Department's procurement due to corrupt or fraudulent practices;
- c) the Tenderer does not have the legal capacity to enter into the contract;
- d) the Entity submitting the bid is insolvent, in receivership, bankrupt or being wound up, has his affairs administered by a court or a judicial officer, has suspended his business activities, or is subject to legal proceedings in respect of the foregoing;
- e) the Tenderer cannot demonstrate that he possesses the necessary professional and technical qualifications and competent, financial resources, equipment and other physical facilities, managerial capability, personnel, experience and reputation to perform the contract;
- f) the Tenderer cannot provide proof that he is in good standing with respect to duties, taxes, levies and contributions required in terms of the legislation applicable to the work in the contract;
- g) the Respondent and any of its directors/shareholders are listed on the Register of Tender Defaulters in terms of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act of 2004 or the National Treasury's Database of Restricted Suppliers (see [www.treasury.gov.za](http://www.treasury.gov.za)) as a person prohibited from doing business with the public sector;
- h) the Tenderer has failed to perform on any previous contract and has been given a written notice to this effect;
- i) the Tenderer or a competent authorized representative of the Entity who submitted the tender has not attended the compulsory clarification meeting or site briefing session if applicable;
- j) the bid-offer is not signed by a person authorized to sign on behalf of the Tenderer;
- k) more than one bid has been submitted by a Tenderer. Each Tenderer shall submit only one bid for the same project, either individually as a Tenderer or as a partner in a joint venture. No Entity can be a subcontractor while submitting a bid individually or as a partner of a joint venture in the same bidding process. An Entity, if acting in the capacity of subcontractor in any bid, may participate in more than one bid, but only in that capacity. A Tenderer who submits or participates in more than one bid will cause all the proposals in which the Tenderer has participated to be disqualified.


