The Chamber of Mines

- **Voluntary private sector organisation – an employer organisation (LRA)**
- **Represent 90% of the mining sector by value**
- **Transformation of the mining sector**
- **The collective voice of the mining sector – an essential partner for Government and Civil Society**

Mining : An essential component of RSA's developmental needs

- Important player in RSA's economic development
- Major earner of foreign exchange, but price taker
- Major supplier of raw materials to RSA's strategic industries – siting and location determined by ore-body
- Historical lapses in environmental and social stewardship
- Critical impacts on water resources - AMD



Comments on the WfGD Framework

- **General Comments:**
 - Enthusiastic mining sector support for the initiative;
 - Aesthetics – spelling errors, lack of consistency of style and repetitions;
 - Recognise limitation of space, but doc must still provide sufficient information to develop sustainable options
- **Specific Comments**
 - Mining not homogeneous – complexity under-explored;
 - Acid mine drainage – too much emphasis on one case study (Witwatersrand basin - but highly relevant case study);
 - Highly irregular to recommend an unsustainable option – sustainable and innovative options must still be explored
 - Recognise and prioritise the implementation of the BPG's in preventing future negative impacts

Challenges identified by the sector

- **Abandoned mines & inter-mine flows**
- **Framework for partnerships**
- **Identification of win-win approaches**
- **Capacity constraints**

Recommendations

- **Enhance and Regularise Strategic DWAF/Mining Sector liaison**
- **Enhance regulatory capacity to eliminate non-compliance**
- **Develop flexible regulatory mechanisms to enhance regional water treatment approaches**
- **Prioritise the implementation of the BPG's to prevention of future impacts and liabilities**
