## Mpumalanga engages stakeholders in the water and sanitation sector in preparation for Operation Phakisa

The Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS) engaged stakeholders in the Mpumalanga Province in a consultative workshop in preparation for the water and sanitation Operation Phakisa to fastrack the delivery of water and sanitation services on 08 April 2019 in Mbombela.

The Provincial workshop was meant to seek inputs from stakeholders in the water and sanitation sector on how to effectively implement the National Water and Sanitation Master through a Phakisa process. The consultative workshop was also used to present the key issues and possible solutions as depicted in the National Water and Sanitation Master Plan.

The Provincial Head of the Mpumalanga Region, Mr Fikile Guma, chaired the workshop and Mr Trevor Balzer presented and outlined the National Water and Sanitation Master Plan and the Operation Phakisa framework. Mr Balzer outlined what the Master Plan is all about reminded the audience of the five pillars of the Department. He further outlined how Operation Phakisa will assist in the achievement of the National Development Plan (NDP) and Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 6 targets.
