## **DWS commemorates World Toilet Day at Loti Primary School**

The theme for the WTD this year is *"Sustainable Sanitation and Climate Change"*, focusing on how sustainable sanitation can assist in mitigating the impact of climate change as it is getting worse. Floods and drought are threatening sanitation systems.

As part of the educational awareness, the learners were also reminded of the importance of proper handwashing to prevent the spread of diseases, especially now that we are faced with the deadly coronavirus.

Ms Lomina Shongwe from the Sanitation unit demonstrated the proper steps of handwashing and also showed the school assistants how to properly clean toilets to keep them clean, hygienic and healthy at all times.









To ensure that the school keeps the toilets clean and the learners and staff members healthy, DWS donated toilet papers, gloves, domestos sachets, multipurpose cleaner, bleach, soaps, sanitizers, toilet brush cleaning sets and buckets.
