The Mpumalanga Provincial Office of the Department for Water and Sanitation (DWS) engaged learners of Sakhile Primary School in Thembisile Hani Local Municipality on 14 October 2020 in a handwashing educational demonstration as part of the Global Handwashing Day awareness roadshow.
