1965. Mr G R Morgan (DA) to ask the Minister of Water and Environmental Affairs:

(a) What (i) total amount of money was owed by municipalities to water boards as at 30 June 2011 and (ii) is the breakdown of this figure in terms of (aa) current debt, (bb) debt in arrears and (cc) money owed by each municipality to each water board and (b) how is the figure for each municipality broken down according to (i) current debt and (ii) arrears?

(a)(i) R1 891 771 340

(a)(ii)(aa) R 764 341 706

(a)(ii)(bb) R1 127 429 634

(a)(ii)(cc) Eleven out of twelve water boards are owed R1, 1 billion (arrears) by municipalities as at end of June 2011. The highest debt was in three water boards dealing mainly with rural municipalities namely Sedibeng Water is owed R354million, Bushbuckridge Water is owed R230 million and Lepelle Northern Water R319million.

This is not a new trend, similarly in March 2009 and March 2010 the same water boards were the highest owed by municipalities. This relates to structural challenges faced by water boards delivering water services in rural areas where there is little and poor management of consumer demands and payments by municipalities responsible for retail services.

The age analysis indicates that the significant part of the debt is above 120 days and this is mainly due to old debt that is accumulating like Bushbuckridge has been owed by the municipality over two years. There have been a lot of negotiations with all stakeholders involve and the Bushbuckridge municipalities have since acknowledged the debt and committed to pay 50% of the R190 million of the December 2009 outstanding amount. The municipalities have further committed to start paying R5 million towards the committed 50% of the debt from January 2012. Currently there is a sort-term Service Level agreement between the municipality and Bushbuckridge water board.

Water boards annual sales are almost R8 billion and the debt forms about 10% of annual sales to municipalities. The municipalities with the highest debt as at end of June 2011 were Mopani (R204m), Matjhabeng (R289m), Capricorn (R51m), Naledi (R20m), Mafikeng (R27m), Bushbuckridge (R190m), Mbombela (R26m), Emfuleni (R29m), Ba-Phalaborwa(R24m), Ditsobotla(R24m).

(b)(i) The total debt reported includes current debt which is the amount that was billed in June by Water Boards to municipalities. Municipalities have 15 days in which to pay this debt. At the time it is billed it is recorded as current debt until it is paid in case where the debt is not paid within the stipulated time frame of 15 days, the dept then falls under 30 days arrears.

(b)(ii) Arrears are all debts 30 days and older including debts that are more than 120 days in arrears.
