REPLY:

Measures have been implemented to address the water challenges in Kgetleng River Municipality and Rustenburg Local Municipality as follows.

Kgetleng River Municipality:

A professional service provider has been appointed by the Kgetleng river Municipality to rectify the problems.

The budgets allocated are as follows, R85 million from Regional Bulk Infrastructure Grand (RBIG), R4.4 million from Provincial Infrastructure Grant (PIG) and R8.0 million from Accelerated Community Infrastructure Programme (ACIP).

Rustenburg Local Municipality:

A professional service provider and contractor has been appointed by the Rustenburg Local municipality for the refurbishment of the upper and lower reservoir in Tlhabane.

The budgets allocated are as follows, R2.5 million from Provincial Infrastructure Grant (PIG) and R3.7 million from Accelerated Community Infrastructure Programme (ACIP).
