ADDITIONAL NOTES ON WATER TRIBUNAL APPEALS FOR THE YEARS IN QUESTION

	1. The term of the Tribunal came to an end in 2012 and was only reconstituted in June 2015 is contributing factor to the less number of appeals prepared for readiness for hearing. 2. A Ministerial Directive dated 2012/09/09 was issued in terms of section 150 of National Water Act 36 of 1998 advising the parties to the appeal to attempt to settle the appeals in terms the provisions of the Act as the Water Tribunal was the placed in abeyance pending the legislative amendments of the National Water Act 36 of 1998 and the fact that the term of the term of the Water Tribunal came to an end. 3. Following this directive by the Minister, appeals were only prepared for the purposes of mediation and due process of preparations of appeals for the purposes of appeal hearing by the Water Tribunal was not conducted as its term came to the end. This has led to the accumulation of appeals and a resultant backlog, both of appeals lodged and the making of appeals ready for hearing	1. In 2016 the Tribunal members together with the Registrar had embarked on auditing the Tribunal files. This involved inter alia: Communication with the Appellants with view of determining if they still interested in pursuing 5the Appeal. This process involved the time frames given to the parties for compliance and exchange of papers amongst the parties and this process took longer to set matters down	1. The process of capacitating the newly appointed Water Tribunal was underway. 2. The process of finalising the audits of previous years during which the Water Tribunal was not constituted and the following issues were discovered and were being dealt with: Matters waiting for replying affidavit; Matters waiting for the reasons and records; Matters waiting for supplementary Appeal; Matters waiting for supplementary; Matters ready for set down; and Withdrawn matters.	 In August 2018 the process of dealing with the backlog was underway. The challenge with the current rules of the Tribunal is that they don't strictly prescribe timeframes upon which the Participants to the Appeal should file papers. Consequently Parties took longer to file the papers in preparation for set-down of the matter. There is currently a discussion for the need to review the rules of the Tribunal. The appointed Chairperson of the Water Tribunal resigned in March 20128 causing further delays as the Chairperson in terms of the act assigned to evaluat4e and allocate the matters to the members. The Department is currently in the process of appointing a new Water Tribunal as the term of the current Tribunal ends on the 01 June 2019. Interviews respectively for the Chairperson and members of the Water Tribunal in this regard have been finalised in terms of the National Water Act and the whole process of appointments is aimed at being finalised by the end of May 2019.
