What is an EMI?

Environmental Management Inspectors (EMIs) are officials appointed under the **National Environmental Management Act (NEMA)** to monitor and enforce compliance with South Africa's environmental laws. EMIs protect **water**, **land**, **air**, **biodiversity**, **and human** health, ensuring individuals, businesses, and government institutions operate within the law.

The **Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS),** as an EMI institution, enforces compliance with both NEMA and the National Water Act (NWA), investigating pollution, monitoring water use, and ensuring sustainable water management for present and future generations.

Why EMI Day Matters

Outcome 4 of the 2023 National Compliance and Enforcement Framework (NECEF) highlights the importance of public awareness in strengthening the EMI network.

- Building awareness of EMIs and their crucial role.
