IT/FS/AT to review and comment prior to circulation to other members.  • WS confirmed that members of the Annual Operating Rules study team had not as yet made contact with him with regard water quality issues. 	<ul> <li>WK stated that although the irrigation requirements themselves may not necessarily be that significant, they do have a significant impact in terms of the timing of the next intervention. This was indicated on the water balance graph contained in the executive summary.</li> <li>WK stated that the system yields were determined excluding irrigation and environmental water requirements, which were treated as requirements on the system. IT suggested that WK contact Alan Bailey at SSI with a view to clarifying system yields (i.e. whether they included or excluded irrigation requirements and return flows) and anticipated water requirements.</li> <li>Following extensive discussions it was agreed that:</li> <li>The Strategy is not to provide for a low and high growth scenario for irrigation but only for 1 "realistic" scenario. All applications would thereafter be managed on that basis;</li> <li>The Strategy is to provide for compensation releases only from Laing and Wriggleswade dams, but include irrigation releases for the Upper Buffalo;</li> <li>This equates to the intermediate scenario as presented in Table 4.18 of the Strategy Study Report.</li> </ul>	wĸ

7.2	WC/WDM - Water Re-Use  IT stressed that WC/WDM and re-use of water are of utmost importance. Therefore the feasibility and availability of water re-use must be fully investigated.	BCM/AW/ ADM

7.5	<ul> <li>Water Quality</li> <li>The issues regarding the recent press releases with regard poor river and sea water quality was raised.</li> <li>WK advised that addressing water quality issues at source of pollution was addressed in the Strategy. BCM and other stakeholders should be required to present progress in their efforts to address these problems.</li> </ul>	ASOCC
	<ul> <li>IT advised that such issues should be addressed at ASOCC meetings.</li> <li>It was then enquired as to whether there was a need to report on water quality to the ASSSC. IT suggested that the Chairperson of the ASOCC should report on such matters if relevant to the implementation of the Reconciliation Strategy at the ASSSC meetings.</li> </ul>	ASOCC
7.6	Climate Change  Climate change is being investigated as part of the Amathole Operating Rules Study. Should it be found that climate change could possibly have an impact on future planning (i.e. reduced system yield with time) they would then feed this information back to the ASATSG.	JP

7.7	Drivers of water requirement within the AWSS  WK advised that housing is likely to be the key driver of water requirement in the AWSS. Therefore, greater clarity regarding the intended delivery was required to better anticipate possible jumps in water requirements. BCM and Province would be key informants in this regard.
