8.4	<ul> <li>Risks in implementing the Strategy</li> <li>WK confirmed that the greatest risk in implementing the strategy is BCM's effectiveness in implementing WC/WDM; WK presented graphs indicating the following:</li> <li>Combined Bridledrift / Nahoon System (Lower Buffalo)</li> <li>Nominal increase in requirement for potable water between 2004 and 2010</li> <li>Significant increase in requirement for raw water over the same period (this indicates increased losses in the raw water system as opposed to a true increase in water requirement).</li> <li>Combined Maden, Rooikrantz, Laing System (Upper / Middle Buffalo)</li> <li>Significant increase in raw water requirement between 2003 and 2010</li> <li>This indicates potential increase in losses, given that there has been nominal development in the area over this period.</li> </ul>
