Notice is hereby given in terms of Regulation 56 of Government Notice (GN) No. R. 543 of 18 June 2010, in terms of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998), as amended and the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Regulations (2010).

PROJECT PROPOSAL & LOCATION:

The Department of Water Affairs (DWA) has proposed the construction of an off-channel storage dam on either the Newabeni River or Gugamela River, which are both tributaries to the Mzimkhulu River, in order to provide for the water requirements of the Mzimkhulu Regional Water Supply Scheme.

The alternative dam sites are situated in the central part of KwaZulu-Natal, approximately 20km north-west of Port Shepstone, and are located close to the southern boundary of Ward 1 of the Umzumbe Local Municipality. The property description is as follows: Alexander Native Location No. 6, Farm Number 16462.

REVIEW OF DRAFT EIA REPORT:

To date, the Scoping phase of the overall environmental assessment for the project has been completed. The Final Scoping Report and Plan of Study for the EIA were approved by the Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA) on 26 April 2012.
