SA must attract more investment

OUTH Africa needs to do more to make its economy attractive to foreign investors and catch up with other developing countries, despite rising two places to become the 13thmost attractive foreign direct investment (FDI) destination globally, says a global management consulting firm.

The AT Kearney FDI confidence index, conducted across 300 of the world's leading multinational corporations, showed that South Africa improved from 15th place in last year's survey to 13. but remains off its best level of 11 reached in 2012.

There is a strong relationship between foreign investment and economic growth, and higher levels of fixed investment ensures that higher growth rates can be achieved on a sustainable basis. Protection of investment rights,

good governance, a stable economy and consistent policies are important ways to attract investment, but South Africa has been falling short on many of these measures

The top 10 countries in the AT Kearney survey attract half of global FDI, which was measured at \$1.4-trillion (R15-trillion) in

2012. While South Africa saw FDI double to \$10-billion (R107-billion) in 2013, this remained more than six times less than fifth-placed Brazil

The US maintained its number one spot in the survey, followed by China, with India, Australia and Singapore all in the top 10. The United Arab Emirates rose three places to 11 mainly because Dubai is in-

creasingly seen as a hub for investment across the Middle East and Africa. AT Kearney's Martin

Sprott said SA should be aiming for \$15-\$20-billion (R107-214-billion) in FDI.

He said most countries that were successful at attracting investors had implemented structured programmes and then driven them at state or federal level. This brought diversity to their manufacturing bases, additional skills, improved economic development and raised productivity, which in turn created jobs. "They almost market their countries as a destination." Sprott said FDI was an ideal

vehicle to compensate for SA's low savings rate and to increase

employment and raise incomes. More programmes should be implemented along the lines of the successful Renewable Energy Independent Power Producer Pro gramme. It raised R74-billion in the first two bidding windows and was pinpointed by AT Kearney as one of the major drivers behind the recent growth in FDI.

"More programmes like that on a sector-bysector basis will take South Africa a long way forward in attracting FDI," said Sprott. Chief economist at ETM Analytics George Glvnos said South Afri ca could be doing better. "When you consider

we are the world's biggest producer of plat-

inum - though we are not producing at the moment - we have a huge mineral base, the most sophisticated economy on the continent in terms of banking and infrastructure and are a gateway to Africa, you should believe we should be attracting more." There was "a whole lot more" that could be done to unshackle the economy, such as greater private sector participation in electricity management, or in the mobile space. — *BDLive*

Top Eskom executives to forego their bonuses

POWER utility Eskom said yesterday that its senior executives would not take their annual bonuses for the 2013-14 financial year to cut costs.

Interim CEO Colin Matjila said top executives had acknowledged the financial constraints Eskom was experiencing. Eskom is expecting a R225-billion revenue shortfall over the five-year period between 2013 and 2018.

"While significant shifts have been made in terms of business operations to achieve internal efficiencies, the company is certain that this revenue shortfall cannot be achieved by belt tightening

Department of Public Enterprises, is in discussions with the National Treasury to find a long-term solution," said Matji-

The National Energy Regulator of South Africa (Nersa) approved a tariff increase of 8% which left Eskom with a funding gap. Eskom said that in response, it had set up a special joint committee which would consider a range of non-conventional sustainable funding solutions, including equity/equity-like instruments.

"It is important that Eskom remains financially sustainable to enable us to keep the lights on whilst we complete the new build programme that will ease the pressure on the national grid," Matjila said. — **BDLive**



Paul Simon, wife in court afterdispute

SINGER-songwriter Paul Simon and his wife, singer Edie Brickell, appeared in court yesterday after their arrest at the weekend at their Connecticut home due to disorderly conduct.

Police in New Canaan, Connecticut, a suburb of New York, said they went to Simon's home on Saturday night to investigate a family dispute. Simon, 72, and Brickell, 48, were arrested and released. During their court appearance yesterday Simon told the judge the disturbance was due to a rare argument.

The judge ordered the couple to return to court on May 16.

Simon is a 12-time Grammy winner who shot to stardom as half of the duo Simon and Garfunkel. He later embarked on a successful solo career. Brickell, a folk rock singer, married Simon in 1992. They have three children. – AFP

World's 'toughest mountain race'

THOUSANDS of ski-mountaineers will make their final preparations today for a gruelling mountain race through the Swiss Alps that is billed as the toughest in the world.

The 5 400 competitors in the "Patrouille des Glaciers" - French for "glacier patrol" - have their eyes glued nervously to the weather reports after heavy snow forced organisers to push the start from today to tomorrow

Familiar long-crested eagle expands hunting grounds

THE rat population around Lovemore Heights in Port Elizabeth might take a knock with a new resident that has been spotted in the area.

Larry, a two-year-old longcrested eagle, has been seen around the Bay for the past two years, and has recently taken up residence in a patch of bluegum trees around the wooded suburb.

The Urban Raptor Project's Arnold Slabbert said he was very happy to hear his "old friend" - named after a 1980s video game character with a peculiar hairstyle - was well and expanding his hunting grounds. "We rescued Larry when he was just a

two-week-old ball of fluff. "People in East London stole him from a nest, thinking he would make a good pet. He had become used to them, and to this day he is still not as afraid

of people as he should be." Slabbert took Larry to a specialised pen at Nel-

> vlei rats. The "love-hate relationship" Slabbert and Larry share has made Slabbert quite fond of the eagle, though he does not necessarily want to make too close contact with "the cocky bird".

Spotlight on men's health

INTERNATIONALLY the month of June is set aside to focus on health issues affecting men.

Prostate cancer (a form of cancer that develops in the prostate - a gland in the male reproductive system), is the most common cancer among South African males and recent statistics reveal that black males are at an increased risk of developing prostate cancer.

This kind of cancer may not show symptoms at first, but in the later stages can cause pain, difficulty in urinating, problems during sexual intercourse and erectile dysfunction.

Prostate cancer can be caused by several things such as age, family history of cancer, ethnicity, diabetes, diet, hormones, vasectomy and excessive drug intake.

There are many types of prostate cancers but the most common one, found in 90% of prostate cancer patients, is called *acinar ade*nocarcinoma.

Screening for cancer is very important in order to diagnose the cancer at an early stage, before symptoms start, when it is easier to treat and when it is more likely to be cured.

Treating prostate cancer could include one or more of the following: surgery (removal of the prostate gland, testes or the inner part of the prostate gland), radiotherapy, hormone therapy, chemotherapy which comprises cryotherapy, steroids and HIFU.

Even though there is no proven way to prevent prostate cancer, risk could be diminished by making healthy life choices including exercise and a healthy diet.

According to the experts men need to: • Start filling cupboards with low-fat foods, reduce their daily dairy products intake; while increasing fruit and vegetable intake, eat more fats from vegetables than from animals. They must add fatty fish such as sardines and salmon as they contain Omega 3 to reduce their risk.

• Replace coffee with green tea and drink little or no alcohol.

• Most importantly, maintain a healthy weight by being a regular at the gym.

• Men are also advised to make regular visits to the doctor or hospital for check-ups.



A PLANNED recording studio for Libode, will aim at retaining local talent and to help them "make it big" at home.

Two toddlers burnt to death in shack
