Free State DWS engages the youth with interest in the water sector

A contingent of aspirant youth from Botshabelo and Thaba-Nchu converged at Rustfontein Dam to learn about opportunities in the water and sanitation sector during a Youth Empowerment Workshop held by the Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS) and Bloemwater recently.

The Youth Empowerment Workshop is one of the flagship programmes the department is using to engage with young people in an effort to empower them and create awareness about opportunities in this sector.

This workshop was welcomed by some of the young people in attendance.
